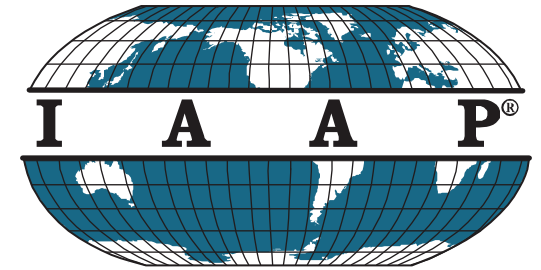
Our Mission and Vision:
